1. Everyone charged with a penal offence has the right to presumed innocent until proved guilty according to law in public trial at which he has all the guarantees necessary for his defense.
2. No one shall be held guilty of any penal offence on account of any act or omission which did not constitute a penal offense, under national or international law, at the time when it was not committed nor shall a behavior penalty be imposed that the one that was applicable at the time penal offense was committed.
3. Men and women of full age, without any limitation due to race, nationality or religion have the right to marry and to found a family. They are entitled to equal rights as to marriage during marriage and its dissolution “the right to your own things”
