“Were always innocent till proven guilty”

Every one charged with a penal offence has the right to presumed innocent until proved guilty to law in public trial at which he has all the guarantees necessary for his defense.

No one shall be held guilty of any penal offense on account of any act or omission which did not constitute a penal offence, under national or international law, at the time when it was committed nor shall a heavier penalty be imposed than the one that was applicable at the time the penal offense was committed.
