Human rights are the right and freedom to which all human are entitled. Human rights are the basic rights which inhere in man by virtue of his humanity. It is the power to cite for

contempt only for violation of its operational guideline and rules of procedure essential to carry out its investigational power.

Human rights also proponents of the concept usually assert that everyone endives with certain entitlements merely by reasons of being human. Human right is thus conceived in a universalism and egalitarian fashion. Such entitlements can exist shared norms of actual human moralities, as justified moral norms or natural rights supported by strong reasons as legal rights. When the constitution requires a person under investigation to be informed of his rights to remain silent and counsel, it must be presumed to contemplate the transmission of meaningful information rather than just the ceremonial and perfunctory recitation of an abstract constitutional principle.

As a rule therefore it would not be sufficient for a police officer just to repeat to the person who under investigation. If all of us has given the rights of our rights, there must be peace in us and if there is peace in us there is human rights for everyone.

We defined the word right as "a privilege," when used in the context of "human rights," we are talking about something more basic. Every person is entitled to certain fundamental rights, simply by the fact of being human. These are called "human rights," rather than a privilege, which can be taken away at someone's whim. Every person is entitled to certain rights-simply by the fact that they are a human being.

No one can take away of our Human Rights, Nothing in this declaration may be interpreted as implying for any State, group or person any right to engage in any activity or to perform any act aimed at the destruction of any of the rights and freedoms set forth herein.

We're always innocent till proven guilty, Everyone charged with a penal offence has the right to be presumed innocent until proved guilty according to law in a public trial at which he has had all the guarantees necessary for his defense. No one shall be held guilty of any penal offence on account of any act or omission which did not constitute a penal offence, under national or international law, at the time when it was committed. Nor shall a heavier penalty be imposed than the one that was applicable at the time the penal offence was committed.
